North Carolina set a record for visitor spending with \$33.3 billion in 2022, a 15.2% increase according to the Department of Commerce.

Growth in direct tourism employment was more evenly distributed among rural and urban counties with more than a quarter seeing double-digit increases. Still, the tourism and hospitality industry faces challenges to continue that growth.

Leaders from across the state recently gathered to discuss tourism and hospitality's growth and where it's headed in the future.
