NCTIA Legislative Session Preview



Rep. Matthew Winslow (R-Franklin/Granville) will join NCTIA Lobbyists Brian Lewis and Skye David for the Legislative Session at this year's NCTIA Tourism Leadership Conference. The session is scheduled for Thursday, November 16 from 1:15-2:45.

Lewis and David will facilitate a conversation with Rep. Winslow that reviews the 2023 Long Session as it pertains to tourism, including legislation enacted, casino and

sports betting politics, school calendar, alcohol modernization, and occupancy tax. The conversation will also center around tourism's ongoing workforce needs throughout the state.

"Rep. Winslow has focused a lot of his legislative attention on workforce development, encouraging students in high school to pursue apprenticeship programs, and getting the K-12 system to rethink its current focus on promoting 4-year colleges and universities as the exclusive path to the middle class," said Lewis.

Rep. Winslow is the Chair of the House Banking Committee and is in the House Leadership as Deputy Conference Chair to Rep. Jason Saine (R-Lincoln), who serves as House Conference Chair.

Rep. Winslow will also receive the 2023 Legislator of the Year Award during the Legislative Session at the NCTIA Tourism Leadership Conference.
